Role	The Classified Senate is a professional organization promoting the interests of all classified, confidential, supervisory staff	CSEA is the exclusive bargaining agent for the classified staff members employed by the District/College.
Purpose	The Classified Senate is organized to: (a) participate in the shared governance structure; (b) provide a body representing the needs, concerns, and viewpoints of the classified, confidential, supervisory staff; (c) provide a centralized means of communication between classified, confidential, supervisory staff and the rest of the district/community; (d) select from its membership representatives to serve on governance and district/college committees; (e) articulate the professionalism of the classified, confidential, supervisory staff so that it is properly recognized and valued; (f) provide an opportunity for enhancing the democratic process of shared governance; (g) provide an opportunity to develop individual leadership among the classified, confidential, supervisory staff, as well as increase the professional standards of its members; (h) promote and develop activities that develop or increase the skills, productivity, and professionalism of the classified, confidential, supervisory staff; (i) promote the interests of the classified, confidential, supervisory staff in the development and formulation of policy and practice related but not limited to the following: *The selection & retention of administrative staff *In-service education staff development *Facilities and services *Student, classified, confidential, supervisory and faculty/classified, relations *Finance and budget	The bargaining agent negotiates and represents general classified staff in contractual issues including but not limited to: (a) wages, including salary schedule and placement, service recognition awards, professional growth awards, promotions, seniority, layoff and re-employment rights, initial classification and reclassification; (b) hours of employment, including pre-retirement reductions in contract; (c) health and welfare benefits, including holidays and vacations; (d) leave. Transfer and reassignment policies, including sick leaves, maternity leaves, bereavement leaves, military leaves, industrial accident leaves, personal necessity leaves, and unpaid leaves of absence; (e) safety conditions of employment, including district-initiated disability leaves; (f) procedures to be used for the evaluation of employees; (g) procedures for processing grievances and disciplinary actions. Bargaining agents also promote the well being and rights of classified employees by: (a) participating in shared governance; (b) representing the needs concerns and viewpoints of the classified staff; (c) serving as a communication link between classified staff and the rest of the district community; (d) selecting from its membership representatives to serve on governance and district/college committees specific to bargaining issues
